



Minutes of the Sixty-First Annual Session

Minutes of the Sixty-First Annual Session Tuesday , August 2, 1994

The regular Business Session of the 61st Annual Conclave of the Florida DeMolay Association was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Brother Scott D. Holland, State Master Councilor. Brother Holland then turned the chair over to Brother Kohl, Credentials Committee Chairman. Brother Kohl took the Roll Call and the Delegate Count was Totaled as follows:

Total Delegate Count:63 Simple Majority: 32 Two-Thirds Majority:42

Brother Kohl then read the following report:

August 2, 1994

To the Delegates of the 61st Annual Conclave:

The Credentials Committee has met and the credentials of all Delegates have been validated in accordance with Section 5.05 of the Statues.

This year, at the Annual Conclave, there are 22 Chapters registered for a total 66 Delegate votes, with five State Officer's votes and one Junior Past State Master Councilor vote, a total of 72 delegate votes. Assuming that all Delegates are present at a Session, a majority would be 37, and a two-thirds majority vote would be 48. A quorum to conduct a Session is 38 Delegates.

Last year's recommendation to continue placing Delegate Registration Forms in the Conclave Registration office to create a more organized, systematic way of accounting for all chapters present was implemented by the State Master Councilor to the best of his ability, due to the fact that the Credential Committee Chairman was not in attendance.

This years' Credentials Committee would like to submit the following recommendations for your approval.

Recommendation 1 Due to the importance of having an accurate account of the numbers of both chapters, and delegates present are, to keep sessions efficient and on schedule, this committee recommends that the next Credentials Chairman be present throughout all conclave registration to ensure complete accuracy of chapter representation

Recommendation 2 Due to the many activities DeMolays tend to be involved in, whether sports or ritual competition that interfere with Delegates ability to attend sessions, this committee recommends that Alternates be permitted to serve in absence of chapter delegates to ensure a quorum.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statues of this Association, this report is physically and fiscally feasible.

Assuming that all Delegates are present at a Session, a majority would be [38], and a two-thirds majority vote would be [51]. A quorum to conduct a Session is [38] Delegates."

The Chair entertained a Motion to pass all unobjected items. Brother Mark Griffis, Brandon Chapter, so moved. Brother Larry Bernard, Sarasota Chapter, seconded. All unobjected parts passed the Delegation Brother Mark Griffis, Brandon Chapter, moved to accept the report as amended. Brother Larry Bernard, Sarasota chapter, seconded the motion. The report was then amended. The report was then approved and passed by the delegation.

Brother Holland called on brother Ed Wood, Chairman of the Nomination Committee. Who read the following report:

Guidance Committee August 4, 1994

To the Delegates of the 61st Annual Conclave,

We, the members of the Guidance Committee have met, and submit the following report for your approval

Recommendation 1 This Committee recommends that the State Master Councilor and the other elected state officers meet with all committee chairmen and state appointed officers, sometime after their installation to discuss and inform the officers of their said duties.

Recommendation 2 This committee recommends that the committee should expand its membership to all state appointed officers and committee chairman in order to find out more information about all the chapters

Recommendation 3 This committee recommends that the Guidance Committee meetings should be held at all zone meetings by the chairman or a representative of this committee

Recommendation 4 This committee recommends that the SMCRs along with the Zone Directors, should plan the time, place, and date of the Fall and Spring area meetings.

Recommendation 5 This committee recommends that the S.M.C. and Guidance Committee should compose and distribute a directory of all members of the committee in order to increase communication and ideas.

Recommendation 6 This committee recommends to the S.M.C., that if SMCRs do not fulfill their responsibilities, that they be removed and be replaced with someone who will perform the duties of that office.

Recommendation 7 This committee recommends that there should be a co-chairman in each zone to serve as the personal representative of this committee.

Athletics 8/4/94

To the Delegates of the 61st Annual Conclave,

We the members of the Athletics Committee have met and submit the following report for your approval.

Last year's recommendation 1 stated the addition of flag football to the Mini-Conclave schedule. This was most implemented, but it is highly recommend for the upcoming Mini-Conclave Schedule.

Last year's recommendation 2 that the 220 yard dash, 880 yard run, 2 mile run, and the 440 yard relay be removed from the Track and Field Competition Schedules. It was not implemented. This Committee also recommends that the 100 yard butterfly, 100 yard backstroke, and the 100 yard breaststroke be removed from the swimming competition. It was not implemented. This Committee also recommends that the golf competition be removed from the conclave schedule. It was implemented.

This Committee submits the following recommendation for your approval:

Recommendation 1 This Committee recommends the addition of bowling to the conclave schedule.

Brother Scott Holland, State Master Councilor, turned the chair over to Brother Joe Earnhardt, Public Relations and Publications Committee Chairman, who read the following report.

Public Relations and Publications Committee 8/3/94

To the delegates of the Sixty-First Annual Conclave,

We, the members of the Public Relations and Publications committee, have met and submit the following report for your approval:

- A) Last year's Recommendation 1 recommended that all future State Master Councilors that create Astivity Programs should include a list of I.S.C materials that can be used for publicizing the Order of DeMolay within their communities. As no Activity Program was produced, this recommendation went unused, but we believe that if one is produced in the future, this recommendation should be used.
- B) Last year's Recommendation 2 recommended that a question and answer column be added to the State Newsletter. Unfortunately, this column went unused. This committee believes that this was because, although it was written in the report, it was not specifically mentioned in the State Newsletter.
- C) Last year's Recommendation 3 recommended that we prepare a format for chapter newsletters. This recommendation was not implemented because the most recent edition of "THE DEMOLAY LEADER'S RESOURCE GUIDE" included a format for chapter newsletters.
- D) Last year's Recommendation 4 recommended that this committee create a list of ways to publicize the Order in their communities. The list was not prepared due to the fact that the most recent edition of "THE DEMOLAY LEADER'S RESOURCE GUIDE" already contains such a list.
- E) Last year's Recommendation 5 recommended that the SMCRs implement a program to publish a Zone Newsletter. Unfortunately, the SMCRs did not implement this recommendation. We believe that this would be a good idea and should be stressed by the incoming State Master Councilor.

This committee now submits the following recommendations for your approval:

Recommendation 1. This committee recommends that, as a means of communication not only between DeMolays in this state, but all over the nation, more DeMolays should use the existing DeMolay computer bulletin boards. There are existing boards on Prodigy, Compuserve, and America Online.

Recommendation 2. This committee recommends that, in order to make the production of the State

Newsletter more frequent, the Public Relations and Publications Committee should take a more active role in the production of the Newsletter.

Recommendation 3. This committee recommends that our state implement a program of chapter, zone, and state fund-raisers so that the State Master Councilor may publicly present the proceeds to a suitable charity decided upon by the incoming State Officers. This would not only help a worthy cause, but it would also promote DeMolay everywhere.

To the Delegates of the Sixty-First Annual Conclave,

We the members of the Constitutional Revisions Committee; after the submission of our original report to the State Master Councilor, at his banquet, per his instructions, have met again. We submit this revised report for you, the delegates of the member chapters of our association, to review in its entirety and to approve those revisions which you the delegates agree with and find favorable.

We have made the following observations:

- 1. We have observed a concern, by the member chapters of our association, over the qualifications of the candidates for the elective offices of our association.
- 2. We have noted disturbances in member chapters of our association in regards to advisors not allowing the due and proper authority of the chapter Master Councilor and that of the voting command of the membership of the chapters in general.
- 3. We have also made record of the discontent of the membership in our association concerning communications. As a result of this discontent it has caused a breakdown of communication, lowering of morale, and failure of functions being properly planned

After due consideration of these facts, and others, in order to make the appropriate changes to the statutes as prescribed by previously enacted legislation, we the members of this committee submit the following recommendations on revisions to the above listed documents.

CHARTER

The several Chapters of the Order of DeMolay in Florida are hereby granted authority to form an organization to be styled "The Florida DeMolay Association". This Association shall exist to further the programs and ideals of the Order of DeMolay ,to promote the progress and well-being of the Chapters and their Members, and to provide a medium for education and communication throughout the Order in Florida provided, that this Association shall have no authority over the particular chapters within this jurisdiction, provided further, that this Association shall have the authority to exercise jurisdiction over the State Master Councilor's Representatives and other such officers as now exist, or may in the future be created, by the Executive Officer.

To accomplish these goals, the Florida DeMolay Association shall be authorized to exact such Constitution, Statutes, and resolutions as shall not be in conflict with the policies or orders of the Executive Officer, and shall have been approved in advance by the Board of Administration.

The "Board of Administration" is hereby created to serve the Florida DeMolay Association, its officers and members, in a general advisory capacity. It shall review and approve all legislation to come before the Association shall have original jurisdiction over any proposition of grievance arising out of the activities of the Florida DeMolay Association, and shall have the authority to construe or dispense with any provision of the Constitution, Statutes of rules of competition, when deems such action to be in the best interest of the Order of DeMolay or this Association, and shall perform other such duties as may be enjoined upon it by the Executive Officer, and it shall serve at his Pleasure.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FLORIDA DEMOLAY ASSOCIATION

Article I Name, Purpose, Colors

Section 1: This organization shall be known as the Florida DeMolay Association, Order of DeMolay (hereinafter, Association).

Section 2: The purposes for which this organization are formed are exclusively educational, religious, and charitable. Not by way of limitation, such purposes shall encompass guidance of DeMolays in their physical, mental, and religious development through specific programs in the fields of physical education, sportsmanship, citizenship, public speaking and the arts, all designed to promote a keen sense of the principles of good citizenship, sportsmanship, of respect for parents and fellowman, and to establish and instill a philosophy of life that will sustain the members of each chapter in the future.

Section 3: The official colors of this Association shall be the royal colors of Purple and Gold.

Article II Allegiance and Authority

Section 1: The Association, it's officers, advisors, and the individuals of member chapters of this Association pledge their allegiance to the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay, its Grand Master, Grand Secretary and the Executive Officer in the State of Florida.

Section 2: This body is constituted with the power and authority to set forth standards in the inter-chapter relations; and to levy fees and dues ,provided that these measures are in harmony with the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay, its Grand Master, Grand Secretary and the Executive Officer in the State of Florida.

Article III

Section 1: The members of this Association shall be all the Chartered Chapters, and those holding Letters Temporary of the Order of DeMolay located in the State of Florida.

Section 2: The members of this Association shall meet annually for the purposes of conducting business, electing officers, holding sports and ritual competition and other activities provided for in the statutes of this Association.

Section 3: In order for the delegation of a member chapter to attend and register, the said delegation must be accompanied by a certified member of the Advisory Council or a Master Mason, approved by the Zone Director for each ten DeMolays or fraction thereof in attendance. No Chapter shall be allowed to register its delegation if said chapter has not paid in full all assessments due this Association.

Section 4: Each member Chapter shall be entitled to be represented by three (3) delegates at the Annual Conclave. This Association shall provide by Statute the manner of voting at delegate sessions.

Section 1: The officers of this Association shall consist of the State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Parliamentarian, State Scribe/ Treasurer, State Senior Deacon, State Junior Deacon, State Senior Steward, State Junior Steward, State Chaplain, State Marshall, State Crator, State Standard Bearer, Seven State Preceptors, State Committee Chairman, and all others selected by the State Master Councilor and /or Executive Officer of the State of Florida.

Section 2: The State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, and State Junior Councilor shall be elected during the general business session of this Association at Conclave assembled each year, and these officers shall serve until their successors are installed.

Section 3(a). The State Scribe/Treasurer shall be appointed by the Board of Administration from a list of two or more nominations submitted to it by the State Master Councilor. The State Scribe / Treasurer shall be appointed at the Annual Mini-Conclave of this Association, or as provided by Article IV Section 5 (c). He shall not be eligible to run for elected office for a period of one year after his appointment. All nominees for the Office of State Scribe/ Treasurer must be a Past Master Councilor, have completed the Leadership Correspondence Course, and be a Representative DeMolay. All candidates for State Scribe/ Treasurer must have a personal savings and/or checking account.

Section 3(b): The State Scribe/Treasurer shall work with an Advisor who is satisfactory to the Board of Administration. The State Scribe/Treasurer shall obtain three (3) or more bids for the cost of printing the Conclave proceedings before the registration of said Conclave.

Section 4: All other State Officers shall be filled by appointment of the State Master Councilor. These officers shall serve until the close of the following Conclave.

Section 5(a): No candidate shall be elected to a State Office who would reach the age of 21 years prior to June 1 of the year following his election. No State Officer may attend an out-of- state school or reside outside the State of Florida during his term of office. Any violation of these provisions shall automatically create a vacancy in the office.

Section 5(b): A vacancy in an appointed State Office may be declared by the State Master Councilor after evaluation of that State Officer's performance.

Section 5(c): A vacancy in an elective State Office may be declared by the State Master Councilor after evaluation of the of the State Officer's performance and with the approval of the Executive Officer. A vacancy will also occur in the State Scribe/ Treasurer upon the recommendation and approval of the State Master Councilor to the Board of the Administration.

Section 6(a): In the event of death, resignation or removal of a State Councilor, each lower State Councilor shall advance to the next highest office and a State Junior Councilor shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the Executive Officer.

Section 6(b): In the event of death, resignation or removal of the State Scribe/ Treasurer, a new State Scribe/ Treasurer shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the Executive Officer.

Section 6(c): Vacancies in all other State Offices shall be filled by appointment of the State Master Councilor.

Section 7(a): A Candidate's Letter of Intent to run for elective State Office must include the following statement:" I have read and am familiar with the Charter, Constitution, and Statutes of this Association:

- (b): The proposed amendment, after the approval of the Jurisprudence Committee and the Board of Administration,, shall be presented for consideration on the floor of Conclave. Upon the approval of two-thirds (2/3) of the delegates present and voting, it shall take effect upon the close of the Annual Conclave

Statutes

Statutes Chapter 1

Section 1.01

Each chapter shall pay as dues the sum of fifteen (\$15.00) dollars for each initiate to the Florida State DeMolay Association, Inc., and shall be payable with the Form 10 reporting the initiation.

Section 1.02:

The revenue derived from the initiation fee in Section 1.01 shall be distributed as follows, 33 1/3 % to the General Account, 33 1/3 % Savings Account, 33 1/3 % as provided in Chapter 4, Section 4.04.

Chapter 2 State Conclave

Section 2.01:

There shall be Ritual Competition, Athletic Competition, State Sweetheart Competition, Election Of State Officers and any other business for the Good of the Order of this Association.

Section 2.02:

There shall be Ritual Competition conducted under the direction of the Executive Officer's Personal Representative for Ritual, assisted by the Chairman of the State Ritual Committee. This competition shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the Old South Tournament.

Section 2.03:

There shall be Athletic Competition conducted under the direction of the State Director of Athletics assisted by the State Athletics Committee. The State Director of Athletics appointed by the Executive Officer, shall appoint for each competition referees for each event who shall use the playing rules established by the Florida State High School Athletics Association.

Section 2.04:

There shall be State Sweetheart Competition. The rules and regulations as determined by the Executive Officer shall be published in the proceedings of the year's Conclave.

Section 2.05:

For the purpose of participation in the activities and/ or competitions sanctioned by this Association, any person who has not yet reached the age of 21 years before the opening of Conclave shall be entitled to participate as an active DeMolay, and at any subsequent level of competition; provided that they have not been certified as an Advisor.

Section 2.06:

There shall a Mini-Conclave, to be held annually in or about the month of January at a specific time and place to be determined by the Executive Officer and Master Councilor.

The Mini- Conclave shall consist of:

- a. Such meetings of the State Officers as are deemed necessary by the State Master Councilor.
- b. All State Committees shall be required to meet and report to the State Master Councilor.
- c. Any other Ritual and/or Athletic Competitions social activities which are deemed necessary and appropriate
- d. The Installation of the State Scribe Treasurer

Section 3 01.

Any qualified DeMolay who desires to run for an Elective Office of this Association shall send a Letter of Intent to the Executive Officer, the State Master Councilor and the Chairman of the Nominating Communice prior to the Opening Session of Conclave The Letter Of Intent will be read aloud before the DeMolay Delegation by the Nominations Chairman prior to elections

Section 3 02

All candidates must be residents of the State of Florida for at least six months prior to the election and shall be members in good standing of a member Chapter of this Association. All candidates for elective State. Office must possess at the time of filing for their Letter of Intent, proof being a Representative DeMolay. Past Master Councilor and a graduate of the Leadership Correspondence Course, copies of such proof shall accompany said letter. Only those brothers who submit a Letter of Intent for office of State Parliamentarian shall be eligible to run for said office. All candidates for the office of State the Parliamentarian shall have read and be familiar with, Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 3.03

All candidates for the Office of State Master Councilor must be a high school graduate or it's equivalent and have been a member of this organization for at least (2) years prior to June 1 of the year of his election."

Section 3.04:

A candidate shall NOT cause any distribution of materials written or oral pertaining to his candidacy before he has submitted his Letter of Intent to the proper persons (as stated in Chapter 3, Section 3.01). The date of submission shall be determined by the Letter of Intent's postmark. He will be authorized to distribute calling cards only. This card will be no larger than the standard Life Membership Card in overall size, and will contain no information other than the name, address, phone number, emblem of the Order of DeMolay, title and or honors, and the title of the office being sought by the candidate. This card will be the only authorized material which may distributed in his behalf at Conclave or at anytime.

Section 3.05:

The election of Officers of this Association shall take place at the discretion of the State Master Councilor during a regular business session at each Annual State Conclave.

Section 3.06:

No more than two (2) Elected State Officers shall be in the same Chapter of this Association

Section 3.07:

The election of Officers shall be in order of rank, the highest being first, the order as provided by this Constitution, by secret ballot of those entitled to vote, as otherwise provided in the Constitution, at each Annual Conclave of this Association. A majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary for a candidate to be elected

Section 3.08

Any qualified candidate who is not elected to the office for which he has submitted a Letter of Intent, may be nominated for a lower office from the floor during elections, subject to the restrictions of Chapter 3 section 3.02, and Section 3.06.

Section 3.09:

The ballots for the election of Officers shall be prepared by the State Scribe /Treasurer for each Annual Conclave. The ballots shall be distributed to each delegate entitled to vote, prior to the opening of elections, and the ballots shall be cast with the full name of the candidate for the particular office legibly written thereon; ballots shall be folded only once. Blank ballots, ineligible ballots and those otherwise deviating from the proper form provided herein shall be tabulated as abstentions

Page 29

Section 3.10(a):

Each member Chapter shall be entitled to be represented by three delegates at the Annual Conclave. Each delegate shall have one vote in all matters brought on the floor of the Conclave, providing he has been certified by his Chapter Advisor and has been registered with the Credentials Committee prior to the Opening Session of Conclave. In the event that less than three (3) delegates from a Chapter are in attendance at Conclave, any or all of the absent delegate votes may be given to a remaining Delegate from that Chapter. In order to accomplish this, the Chapter Advisor must submit written authorization to the Credentials Committee before the opening business section of Conclave.

Section 3.10 (b):

All of a Chapter's delegates must be members of said Chapter.

Section 3.11(a)

Every Past State Master Councilor who has not reached the age of twenty-one (21) years and is properly registered will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave

Section 3.11(b):

The State Senior Councilor, the State Junior Councilor, and the State Scribe/ Treasurer will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave.

Section 3.12:

Each Chapter Delegation shall elect a Delegation Chairman during the business sessions, the vote of the delegation shall be announced by the Chairman of the delegation with the exception of secret ballot for State Officer Elections.

Chapter 4 **Duties of State Officers**

Section 4.01:

The State Master Councilor shall be the duly elected head of this Association, and it shall be his duty to perform all duties which naturally pertain to such an office or which may devolve upon him from time to time.

Section 4.02:

The State Master Councilor shall preside at the Annual Conclave.

Section 4.03:

The State Master Councilor shall appoint all committee chairmen of this Association and in consultation with each chairman, appoint the committee members.

Section 4.04:

The State Master Councilor shall have an expense account equal to 33 1/3 % of the amount collected for each initiate reported to the Florida State DeMolay Association Inc., on Form 10's which shall be used for reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of his and other State Officers duties, with the State Master Councilor's approval.

Section 4.05:

An Elected State Officer shall in person, visit each Chapter in this state, at least once during his term of office, so far as applicable.

The State Master Councilor shall report in writing to the Association at each Annual Conclave, all of his official acts, whether performed in person or by Personal Representative.

Section 4.07:

The State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, and the State Scribe/ Treasurer shall represent the State Master Councilor when so ordered, assist the State Master Councilor in every way possible in the discharge of his duties, and shall report to this association at each Annual Conclave, all of their official acts.

Section 4.08:

The State Scribe/Treasurer's records shall be subject to an audit conducted by the Executive Officer

Section 4.09(a):

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall record the minutes of the Annual Conclave of this Association and any official State meeting. He shall then within sixty (60) days have the aforesaid minutes, together with the Constitution and Statutes of their latest revision, published with the rules of the Sweepstakes Competition, and distributed as follows:

- 1. One copy to each member Chapter of this Association.
- 2. Copies to the Executive Officer, one copy to each member of the Supreme Council residing in the state, and one copy to any advisor appointed by the Executive Officer in a supervisory capacity, including the Board of Administration.
- One copy to the State Master Councilor, Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, and the State Parliamentarian.
- 4. One copy to the International Supreme Council.
- 5. One copy to of the State Committee Chairmen.
- 6. One copy to each Jurisdiction in Region 3 of the International Supreme Council, sent to the Executive Officer.

Section 4.09(b):

The State Scribe /Treasurer with the approval of the State Scribe /Treasurer Advisor, shall have the authority to correct any grammatical and typographical errors as he deems necessary and appropriate.

Section 4.09 (c):

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall work with an Advisor who is satisfactory to the Board of Administration. The State Scribe/Treasurer shall obtain three (3) or more bids for the cost of printing the Conclave Proceedings before the Registration of said Conclave.

Section 4.10:

The State Scribe /Treasurer shall, under the direction of the State Master Councilor, and /or the Association conduct all correspondence of this Association.

Section 4.11

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall keep and maintain a true copy of the Constitution and Statutes of the Florida DeMolay Association. He shall also supply a copy for the Board of Administration, and one for the Executive Officer of Florida.

Section 4.12:

The State Scribe /Treasurer shall make disbursement for this Association with the approval of the Executive Officer. The State Scribe / Treasurer shall make an itemized report of all transactions in connection with this office at the Annual Conclave.

Chapter 5 Committees

Section 5.01

All committees shall be responsible for reporting on the fiscal and physical feasibility of their proposals

Section 5.02:

The duties of the Jurisprudence Committee shall be to determine the constitutionality of all motions, resolutions, and proposals presented by the standing committees or from the floor of Conclave. The State Parliamentarian shall act as Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee.

Section 5.03:

The duties of the Nominations Committee shall be,

(a) to receive and review letters of intent filed by person(s) seeking qualification as (a) candidate(s) for Elective State Office; upon completion of the review the Chairman shall notify the prospective candidate of approval or shall notify him of deficiencies therein, such review and notification shall be completed within twenty (20) days after receipt of the letter by the Chairman; a candidate may submit an amended Letter of Intent which shall also be reviewed as specified herein above.

Section 5.04:

The Membership Committee shall study and promote an active program for the acquisition of eligible youth in this Jurisdiction.

Section 5.05:

The duties of the Credentials Committee shall be to validate the credentials of all Delegates to Conclave in accordance with Chapter 3, Sections 3.11 and 3.12 of the Statutes, this committee shall be responsible for arranging the seating of said delegates.

Section 5.06:

The duty of the Public Relations and Publications Committee shall be to promote the image of DeMolay before the general public. It shall also be the duty of this committee to inform and assist member Chapters in the Annual DeMolay Week program. This committee shall oversee any publication of this Association and any related programs.

Section 5.07:

The State Ritual Committee shall promote uniformity in the ritual of the Order of DeMolay throughout this Association, and shall recommend to the Association for approval, procedures for the performance of ritualistic matters not set forth specifically set forth in the Ritual of Secret Work of the Order of DeMolay and methods of receiving introducing and accommodating those who are entitled to recognition in all Conclaves, meetings, and public ceremonies of the Association. It shall also develop review and revise any State ceremonies which may used by this Association.

The Athletics Committee shall work with the State Sports Director in acquiring qualified, unbiased judging officials for all State Athletics Competitions. They are also to make certain that no Advisors shall judge their own Chapters. They shall also review and submit any proposals to the State Master Councilor.

The duty of the Constitutional Revisions Committee shall be to recommend pertinent and necessary revisions to the Constitution and Statutes.

The Knighthood Committee shall report to the Delegates on the activities of the State Priory

Section 5 11

The Budget and Finance Committee shall review the financial status of this Association and report the same to the Delegates of the Annual Conclave. Any proposals, including committee recommendations containing fiscal impact shall be submitted to this committee for it's review and recommendation. It shall also be the committee's responsibility to put together the Conclave Program and such advertisements necessary for it's production

This committee shall also present a proposed comprehensive budget for this Association to the delegates and, upon approval, present the proposed budget for this Association to the Executive Officer The expenditures of this Association shall not exceed its income from Conclave to Conclave

Section 5 12:

The Guidance Committee shall be the duly appointed State Master Councilor's Representatives of the of the several Zones and the State Appointed Line Officers and Committee Chairman. This Committee will function at the will of the State Master Councilor. It shall act in an advisory capacity to relay to the State Master Councilor the suggested needs of the individual zones and the State as a whole

Section 5.13:

The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Chairmen of all of the Committees, the Elected State Officers, State Scribe/ Treasurer, and all Past State Master Councilors who have not reached their majority. It shall be chaired by the State Master Councilor, and shall meet at his discretion.

Section 5.14:

The State Master Councilor shall announce the names of the appointed Committee Chairman, Appointed State Officers, and State Master Councilor's Representatives at the last business session of the State Conclave. The names of the Chairmen shall be published, with the exception of the State Credentials Committee Chairman in the current proceedings of this Association.

Section 5.15:

The State Master Councilor shall have the authority to appoint one advisor to each committee with the consultation of the Committee Chairman and the Director, if one has been appointed.

Section 5 16:

It shall be the duty of each committee to submit to the State Master Councilor a report upon request It shall also be the duty of each State Committee Chairman to gather suggestions and recommendations from the member Chapters and combine them with his own ideas and submit them to the State Master Councilor as a tentative agenda thirty(30) days prior to Conclave.

Section 5.17:

The final committee reports shall be typewritten and submitted to the State Scribe/ Treasurer no later than the beginning of the last business session at each Conclave.

Section 5 18

The final report from each state committee must be read and passed by a simple majority vote of the Delegates prior to the close of Conclave.

Section 5 19

The State Master Councilor shall have the power to establish and abolish additional committees (with the exception of standing committees) as deemed necessary.

Section 5 20-

Each individual state committee shall be responsible for implementing the recommendations made by that committee and approved by the delegates, at the most recently conducted Conclave. The Executive Officer shall oversee and coordinate this implementation Page 33

Section 5.21

All committees shall physically meet at least three (3) times a year prior to the opening session of Conclave and submit minutes of these meetings to the State Master Councilor at the Annual Conclave, (with the exception of the Executive Committee).

Chapter 6 State Master Councilor's Representatives

Section 6.01:

It will be the duty of each State Master Councilor's Representative to promote Florida DeMolay and it's communications to the members of this Association.

Section 6.02:

It will the duty of each State Master Councilor's Representative to provide monthly reports to the State Master Councilor, Guidance Committee Chairman, and State Officer in charge of his zone, concerning the progress, activities, and the needs of his chapter and zone.

Section 6.03:

State Master Councilor's Representatives will be required to attend all meetings of the Guidance Committee of this Association.

Section 6.04:

State Master Councilor's Representatives shall act as personal representatives of the State Master Councilor, to serve on his behalf when no other ranking State Officer is present.

Section 6.05:

Each Zone will have one (1) State Master Councilor's Representative for every three Chapters or fraction thereof. State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor to serve at his will.

Section 6.06:

State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be obligated to attend both Mini- Conclave and Conclave.

Section 6.07:

All State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be required to begin working on their L.C.C. and R.D. within thirty days after their appointment, if they have not previously completed them. Proof of which, must be furnished by his Chapter Advisor.

Chapter 7 State Appointed Officers

Section 7.01:

State Appointed Officers shall include; the State Parliamentarian, State Senior Deacon, State Junior Deacon , State Senior Steward , State Junior Steward , State Orator, State Sentinel , State Chaplain , State Marshall, State Standard Bearer, State Almoner, and the State Seven Preceptors.

Section 7.02:

it shall the duty of each State Appointed Officer to promote the Florida DeMolay Association and its communications to the members of this Association.

Section 7.03:

It shall be said Officers duty to provide monthly reports to the State Master Councilor concerning the progress, activities and needs of their Chapter and Zone Page 34

Section 7.04:

State Officers will be required to attend all meetings of the Public Relations and Publications Committee.

Section 7.05

State Officers shall act as a Personal Representative of the State Master Councilor when no other ranking officer is present.

Section 7.06:

Said Officers will be required to memorize their portions of the Ritual Ceremonies.

Section 7.07:

Said officers shall be required to begin working on their L.C.C. and R.D., within thirty (30) after their appointment, if they have not previously completed them.

Section 7.08

Said Officers shall be obligated to attend both Conclave and Mini-Conclave...

Section 7.09:

The State Parliamentarian shall decide the constitutionality of all motions, resolutions, and proposals presented by the standing committees or from the floor of Conclave, when so requested by the State Master Councilor.

Chapter 8 Amendments

Section 8.01:

These Statutes can be amended by a simple majority vote of the delegation, and such amendments may be substituted any time prior to the first Business Session of Conclave, and need only be submitted to the delegates of the Chapters in attendance at the Conclave.

Section 8.02:

These amendments, shall upon the approval of the Board of Administration and the delegation, take effect immediately.

Sweetheart Rules

State Sweetheart Rules For Sweethearts and Their Chaperones

General Rules

All Sweethearts and their Chaperones must abide by the rules of the Executive Officer, Conclave Director, and Sweetheart Committee.

There must be an adult female chaperone or legal parent for every three Sweethearts to attend any Conclave function. Chaperones must be at least 25 (twenty-five) years of age. No Exceptions.

Contestants for State Sweetheart must room with their Chaperones.

Chaperones should conform to all rules and regulations including the dress code for female Chaperones.

ALL Sweethearts and their Chaperones must be officially registered through an active DeMolay Chapter with the approval of the Advisory Council.

- In case of problems or questions, contact only the State Sweetheart Chairman or Committee!
 Do not contact the hotel staff.
- 2. Each Sweetheart must be a current Chapter Sweetheart, only one entry per Chapter will be accepted.
- 3. Sweetheart Contestants must be between the ages of fifteen (15) and twenty (20) years old as of July 1st of the year they compete and attending a Florida school or be a High School Graduate. They must wear name tags at all times and they are required to attend the first briefing session.
- All Sweethearts should exemplify the highest DeMolay ideal of womanhood and conduct themselves in a lady-like manner.
- Sweetheart Contestants cannot be engaged to be married, married, annulled, divorced, be or ever have been pregnant.
- Sweetheart Contestants must have their parent's or guardian's approval in writing and submitted to the State Sweetheart Committee Chairman <u>before</u> the beginning of Conclave, together with a completed standard Florida DeMolay medical release form.
- 7. Each Sweetheart Contestant and her Chaperone must be registered and staying at Conclave (in the same room) the entire session. The Chaperone must know where her (his) Sweetheart is at all times. A Sweetheart Contestant Chaperone may not chaperone anyone else.
- 8. Sweetheart Contestants will be permitted to run no more than twice for State Sweetheart. Any girl who has been State Sweetheart is ineligible to run again.
- 9. A suitable 5 x 7 photo , preferably in color, must be submitted to the State Sweetheart Chairman the first day of Conclave. No other size photo will be accepted , and the photo will not be returned.
 (Photos with crown and sash will be permitted).
- 10. Pictures, cards, brochures, or any other campaign materials will not be distributed by a sweetheart or for her by any others. Sweethearts or female guests will not campaign in any way for candidates runnning for DeMolay State Office.

- Any infraction of these rules by anyone may cause a Sweetheart Contestant to be disqualified from competition.
- Sweetheart Contestants may not leave the hotel premises without a Chaperone and permission from a member of the State Sweetheart Committee
- 13. No DeMolay will be permitted to enter a Sweetheart's room.
- Sweetheart Contestants are not permitted in the vicinity of the ballot box while DeMolays are voting for State Sweetheart.
- 15. Each DeMolay will vote for three (3) girls for State Sweetheart, indicating their first, second, and third choice. Each first place vote will receive three (3) points; second place will receive two (2) points; third place will receive one (1) point. The girl receiving the highest number of points will be the State Sweetheart. There must be three different, eligible Sweetheart names on each ballot.
- A member of the B.O.A. shall be present at the counting of the votes to assist the Sweetheart Committee.
- The State Sweetheart cannot concurrently serve as a Chapter Sweetheart. She must resign from her chapter position upon election as State Sweetheart
- 18. The State Sweetheart must notify the State Sweetheart Chairman within 15 Days of her election who her official Chaperon will be; Any time the State Sweetheart attends any function wearing her Florida State Sweetheart sash and/or crown, she is under the State Sweetheart rules. The State Sweetheart must be Chaperoned from the time she leaves her home until the time she returns home.
- 19. It is the duty of the State Sweetheart to keep the State Sweetheart Chairman informed on all of her official activities.
- Any engraving done on the State Sweetheart trophy or plaque will be paid for immediately by the F.S.D.A Sweetheart fund on presentation of a bill to the State Sweetheart Chairman.
- 21. The State Sweetheart is responsible for the crown, sash, cape, and crown box which will be returned to the State Sweetheart Chairman, in the same condition they were received in, at the beginning of conclave of upon request.
- State Conclave registration for the out going State Sweetheart will be paid for by the Florida DeMolay association. (CONTACT THE STATE SWEETHEART CHAIRMAN.)
- 23. If the State Sweetheart marries, becomes engaged to be married, moves out of Florida, becomes pregnant, or leaves for 30 days, she must resign and return all State Paraphernalia. The first runner-up will replace her.
- 24. The State Sweetheart should be willing and able to travel to various parts of Florida to DeMolay activities, and also, to State DeMolay Functions when invited!!!

Dress Code

- 1. Contestants should at all times be dressed in good taste and appropriately for the occasion
- 2 Dresses are recommended for most functions. It is understood that at all times bras, panties, slips, and hose will be worn with all dresses.

General Conclave Rules, Dress and Regulations

Florida State DeMolay Association ,INC. General Conclave Rules , Dress & Regulations

One of the best, most pleasant of the DeMolay year is our Annual State Conclave. Everyone will have a much more enjoyable time if we all obey a few ground rules.

Our Statutes prohibit behavior likely to bring disrespect upon the Order of DeMolay and conduct unbecoming that expected a member of our Order. Additionally, the Laws of the host city, the State of Florida and the United States, are to be obeyed at all times by everyone attending Conclave. The following General Rules are for the protection of everyone at Conclave:

- Our Statutes prohibit possession, use or consumption by DeMolays at Conclave of beer, liquor or controlled substances, including but not limited to cannabis, hallucinogens or other substances defined as "Controlled" by Florida Law.
- No tobacco products. The use of any tobacco products, cigars, cigarettes, snuff or chewing tobacco, will not be allowed by any DeMolay during Conclave or at any other DeMolay function.
- For your own protection and the protection of others, possession of firearms, fireworks, other explosives, switchblade knifes and other like items or materials are prohibited.
- 4. No DeMolays are allowed on the floor where the Sweethearts are housed
- 5. Dress for the evening meals will be shirt and tie, coats will be optional.
- Shirt and tie are required for all Delegate Sessions and the General Opening. Dress for the banquet is formal or semi-formal.
- 7. Swimming suits are not allowed in the main lobby or in the video game room.
- 8. No Sweethearts or female guests are allowed in any DeMolay room.
- 9. Any damage to the hotel room will be billed to the persons registered in the room.
- Room occupants are responsible for incidental charges such as telephone calls out of the hotel, special TV charges.
- Anyone observing breach of these rules shall immediately report the activity to the Conduct Room or Conclave Office.

In the event that the Conduct Committee determines that a breach of these rules has occurred in any area at Conclave, all persons involved will be subject to being immediately sent home. Provided, that if the event is an isolated occurrence and no actual or constructive knowledge of the breach or infraction can be attributed to all persons in the area, only those involved in the event will be sent home. If a person (s) are sent home, his /her parents are responsible for all transportation charges and will be immediately advised of the reason for the individual's expulsion from Conclave. No refund will be made to those persons sent home.

By the authority of Article 13, paragraph 213.1 of the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay, the continuation of an organization styled, "The Florida DeMolay Association," consisting of the several chapters of the Order of DeMolay in Florida, is hereby granted. This association shall exist to further the programs and ideals of the Order of DeMolay, to promote the progress and well-being of the Chapters and their members, and to provide a medium for education and communication throughout the Order in Florida; provided that this Association shall have no authority over the particular Chapters within this Jurisdiction; provided further that this Association shall have the authority to exercise jurisdiction over the State Master Councilor, other officers and representatives as now exist or that may be created by the Executive Officer.

To accomplish these goals, the Florida DeMolay Association is authorized to enact such Constitution, Statutes and Resolutions as shall not be in conflict with the policies or orders of the Executive Officer, and shall have been approved in advance by the Board of Administration.

Said Board of Administration shall continue to serve the Florida DeMolay Association its officers and members, in a general advisory capacity. It shall review and approve all legislation to come before the Association shall have original jurisdiction over any proposition of grievance arising out of the activities of the Florida DeMolay Association, and shall have the authority to construe or dispense with any provision of the Constitution, Statutes or Rules of Competition, when it shall deem such action to be in the best interest of the Order of DeMolay or this Association, and shall perform such other duties as may be enjoined upon it by the Executive Officer, and shall serve at his pleasure.
